

Mr. Eduardo Osvaldo Zappettini has 35 years of professional experience in mineral resources, metallogeny, geotectonics and petrology research projects. He has published more than 150 research papers in national and international conferences and journals. From 2004-2020 he was Chairman of the Sub-Committee on Metallogenic Maps of the World (Commission of the Geological Charter of the World). From 2016-2020 he served as Chairman of the International Association on the Genesis of Ore Deposits (IAGOD). Since 1994, he has held a number of management positions in the Geological Mining Service of Argentina, where he is the chairman since 2020.







Mr. Martín Ricardo Gozalvez has 20 years of professional experience working at the Geological Mining Service of Argentina (SEGEMAR). He has been a member of the team of experts in metallogeny of the Directorate of Mineral Resources since 2010, and is in charge of the execution of the National Programme of Metallogenetic Cartography and Industrial Minerals. He has been the Director of the Institute of Geology and Mineral Resources of SEGEMAR since April 2020. His activities in scientific and technical societies began in the period 2011 to 2013, when he served as President of the Geological Association of Argentina. As of 2020, he is the coordinator of the Group of Experts in Metallogeny and Mineral Resources of the Iberoamerican Association of Geological and Mining Services (ASGMI).



Felipe Espinoza González Head of General Geology Department, National Geology and Mining Service Chile (SERNAGEOMIN)

Mr. Felipe Espinoza González is a member of the National Geology and Mining Service - SERNAGEOMIN since 2007. He has worked as project geologist (2007-2010) and project manager (2010-2014), in geological survey studies for the creation of regional geological cartography. Since 2014, he has been the Head of the General Geology Department and is in charge of the National Geology Plan, which is the state programme for the publication of basic geological, geophysical and geochemical mapping of the Chilean territory.
